1.9	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The commissioner shall establish a program to award
1.10	grants to postsecondary institutions to provide courses at the master's level or higher for
1.11	concurrent enrollment instructors teaching in Minnesota secondary schools. This program
1.12	must address the Higher Learning Commission's professional development qualification
1.13	standards used to document the qualifications of a concurrent enrollment instructor as a
1.14	content expert with competence to teach discipline-specific content in the classroom.
1.15	Subd. 2. Application process. (a) The commissioner shall develop an application process
1.16	for awarding grants. In awarding grants, the commissioner shall consider the needs of
1.17	concurrent enrollment instructors throughout the state in accessing graduate course offerings.

3.5	136A.1277. The commissioner may use up to three percent of this appropriation for program
3.6	administration.
