1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. [126C.90] COMPREHENSIVE SUPPORT FOR SCHOOLS IN NEED.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Comprehensive support revenue. The comprehensive support revenue
1.8	equals the sum of the school site's English learner cross subsidy aid, schoolbook aid, extended
1.9	school year aid, prekindergarten program aid, school social worker aid, school counselor
1.10	aid, school nurse aid, library media specialist aid, paraprofessional aid, full-service
1.11	community school coordinator aid, and homeless liaison aid. An elementary school site
1.12	qualifies for aid under this section if it is identified as in need of comprehensive support
1.13	under Minnesota's state plan of the Every Student Succeeds Act.
1.14	Subd. 2. English learner cross subsidy aid. A school site's English learner cross subsidy
1.15	aid equals the difference between the site's English learner aid for the second previous year
1.16	and its English learner revenue for that year.
