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This act may be cited as the "Minnesota Swan Protection Act."

Sec. 6. SWAN PROTECTION EDUCATION AND OUTREACH; APPROPRIATION.

\$1,400,000 in fiscal year 2024 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of natural resources for designating swan resting areas under this act and to provide increased education and outreach promoting the protection of swans in the state, including education regarding the restrictions on taking swans. This is a onetime appropriation and is available until June 30, 2026.

Sec. 7. LEAD TACKLE COLLECTION PROGRAM; APPROPRIATION.

\$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2024 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of the Pollution Control Agency for a lead tackle reduction program that provides outreach, education, and opportunities to safely dispose of and exchange lead tackle throughout the state.
