1.5	Section 1. MINNESOTA BASIC INCOME GRANT PROGRAM.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The commissioner of human services must establish a
1.7	competitive grant program for local government entities, Minnesota's Tribal Nations, or
1.8	nonprofit organizations to provide regular cash payments to eligible recipients in order to
1.9	disrupt poverty, build wealth, advance equity, and support a recipient's basic needs.
1.10	Subd. 2. Eligible applicants. To be eligible for a grant under this section, applicants
1.11	must be a local government entity, Minnesota Tribal Nation, or nonprofit organization; have
1.12	the capability to provide monthly payments to eligible recipients; and meet the requirements
1.13	under this section.
1.14	Subd. 3. Applications. Entities seeking grants under this section must apply to the
1.15	commissioner. The grant applicant, in its application, must include:
1.16	(1) an initial basic income program design and proposal;
1.17	(2) a plan to identify eligible recipients the applicant intends to serve under this section;
1.18	(3) a rationale for identifying those specific eligible recipients;
1.19	(4) a plan for involving community members in the design of the program;
1.20	(5) a commitment to participate in the basic income community of practice under
1.21	subdivision 6;
