The board may receive and expend money to acquire conservation 2.16 easements, as defined in chapter 84C, on behalf of the state and federal government consistent 2.17 with the Camp Ripley's Army Compatible Use Buffer Project, Sentinel Landscape program, 2.18 or related conservation programs. 2.19
