2.22 (g) \$1,000,000 in fiscal year 2016 is for a
2.23 grant to Assistive Technology of Minnesota,
2.24 a statewide nonprofit organization that is
2.25 exclusively dedicated to the issues of access
2.26 to and the acquisition of assistive technology.
2.27 ~~The purpose of the grant is to acquire assistive~~
