1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 609.502, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.7 Subdivision 1. **Concealing evidence.** ~~Whoever~~ A person is guilty of a felony and

1.8 may be sentenced under subdivision 1a if the person interferes with the body or scene of

1.9 death with intent to:

- 1.10 (1) conceal the body;
- 1.11 (2) conceal evidence; or
- 1.12 (3) otherwise mislead the coroner or ~~conceal evidence is guilty of a gross~~
- 1.13 ~~misdemeanor~~ medical examiner.

1.14 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective August 1, 2016, and applies to crimes

1.15 committed on or after that date.

1.16 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 609.502, is amended by adding a subdivision

1.17 to read:

1.18 Subd. 1a. **Penalty.** A person convicted under subdivision 1, clause (2) or (3), is

1.19 guilty of a gross misdemeanor. A person convicted under subdivision 1, clause (1), may

1.20 be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than three years or to a payment of a fine

1.21 of not more than \$5,000 or both.
