1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. [16F.01] MINNESOTA YOUTH COUNCIL COMMITTEE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. <b>Establishment and membership.</b> The Minnesota Youth Council
1.7	Committee is established within and under the auspices of the Minnesota Alliance With
1.8	Youth. The committee consists of four members from each congressional district in
1.9	Minnesota and four members selected at large. Members must be selected through an
1.10	application and interview process conducted by the Minnesota Alliance With Youth. In
1.11	making its appointments, the Minnesota Alliance With Youth should strive to ensure
1.12	gender and ethnic diversity in the committee's membership. Members must be between
1.13	the ages of 13 and 19 and serve two-year terms, except that one-half of the initial members
1.14	must serve a one-year term. Members may serve a maximum of two terms.
1.15	Subd. 2. Duties. The Minnesota Youth Council Committee shall:
1.16	(1) provide advice and recommendations to the legislature and the governor on
1.17	issues affecting youth;
1.18	(2) serve as a liaison for youth around the state to the legislature and the governor; and
1.19	(3) submit an annual report of the council's activities and goals.
1.20	Subd. 3. Partnerships. The Minnesota Youth Council Committee shall partner with
1.21	nonprofits, the private sector, and educational resources to fulfill its duties.
1.22	Subd. 4. Youth Council Committee in the legislature. (a) The Minnesota Youth
1.23	Council Committee shall meet at least twice each year during the regular session of the
1.24	legislature.

2.8	(c) The leaders of the majority and minority parties of the house of representatives
2.9	and senate shall each appoint one legislator to serve as a legislative liaison to the
2.10	committee. Leadership of the house of representatives and senate, on rotating years, may
2.11	appoint a staff member to staff the committee.
