<u>GRANT PROGRAM.</u>

(a) \$10,000,000 in fiscal year 2025 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of information technology services for the public land survey system monument grant program under Minnesota Statutes, section 381.125, and for grants to counties to employ county technical staff to aid surveyors making land survey corners. The base for this appropriation is \$10,000,000 in each of fiscal years 2026 and 2027.

(b) Each fiscal year, up to \$350,000 of an appropriation for the public land survey system monument grant program under Minnesota Statutes, section 381.125, may be used by the

chief geospatial information officer for the administration of the grant program.
