1.7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.8 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 16C.087, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.9 Subdivision 1. **Professional services covered.** This section applies to an agency contract

1.10 for professional services of persons regulated by the Board of Architecture, Engineering,

1.11 Land Surveying, Landscape Architecture, Geoscience, and Interior Design ~~for which the~~

1.12 ~~agency, with the approval of the commissioner, decides to use procedures under this section.~~

1.13 ~~If the agency, with the approval of the commissioner, decides to use procedures under this~~

1.14 ~~section, it must comply with subdivisions 2, 3, and 4.~~ This section does not apply to an

1.15 agency contract that is subject to section 16B.33.

1.16 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 16C.087, subdivision 3, is amended to read:

1.17 Subd. 3. **Procedures.** Subject to subdivision 2, procedures for screening and selection

1.18 of contractors are within the sole discretion of the agency ~~and~~ but must be approved by the

1.19 commissioner ~~when the agency seeks approval to use this alternative.~~ Procedures may be

1.20 adjusted to accommodate the agency's cost, scope, and schedule objectives for a particular

1.21 project. Screening and selection procedures may include a consideration of each contractor's:

1.22 (1) specialized expertise, capabilities, and technical competence as demonstrated by the

1.23 proposed approach and methodology to meet the project requirements;

2.1 (2) resources available to perform the work, including any specialized services, within
2.2 the specified time limits for the project;

2.3 (3) record of past performance, including but not limited to price and cost data from
2.4 previous projects, quality of work, ability to meet schedules, cost control, and contract
2.5 administration;

2.6 (4) ownership status and employment practices regarding women, minorities, and
2.7 emerging small businesses or historically underutilized businesses;

2.8 (5) availability to the project locale;

2.9 (6) familiarity with the project locale;

2.10 (7) proposed project management techniques; and

2.11 (8) ability and proven history in handling special project constraints.

2.12 Sec. 3. **EFFECTIVE DATE.**

2.13 Sections 1 and 2 are effective January 1, 2025, and apply to solicitations for contracts
2.14 issued on or after that date.
