CRITICAL MATERIALS RECOVERY ADVISORY TASK FORCE. 1.6 Subdivision 1. **Definition.** For the purposes of this section, "critical materials" means 17 materials on the final 2023 Critical Materials List published by the United States Secretary 1.8 of Energy in the Federal Register on August 4, 2023, as amended, as required under section 1.9 7002 of the Energy Act of 2020. 1.10 Subd. 2. Composition of task force.
