1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. AMERICAN INDIAN BIRTH CENTER PLANNING GRANT.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Appropriation. \$350,000 is appropriated in fiscal year 2025 from the
1.7	general fund to the commissioner of health for a grant to the Native American Community
1.8	Clinic to plan for and engage the community in the development of an American Indian
1.9	focused birth center to improve access to culturally centered prenatal and postpartum care
1.10	with the goal of improving maternal and child health outcomes. This is a onetime
1.11	appropriation.
1.12	Subd. 2. Use of funds. The Native American Community Clinic must use the grant funds

2.10	center in Hennepin County;
2.11	(2) outlines potential state and public partnerships;
