	terminated, or is rescinded by the proper authority, all waivers or modifications issued by
	the commissioner of human services in response to the COVID-19 outbreak that have not
	been extended as provided in subdivisions 1 and 2 of this section may remain in effect for
	no more than 60 days, only for purposes of transitioning affected programs back to operating
•	without the waivers or modifications in place.
	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
	When the peacetime emergency declared by the governor in response to the COVID-19 outbreak expires, is terminated, or is rescinded by the proper authority, the provisions in Executive Order 20-26 authorizing the use of telemedicine in the medical cannabis program to conduct patient assessments to certify patient qualifying medical conditions, and to perform consultations between patients or caregivers and manufacturer employees licensed as pharmacists before the distribution of medical cannabis, shall remain in effect until June
	30, 2021.
