1.11	applicant requests a lesser amount. The county or city receiving a grant must provide for
1.12	the remainder of the costs of the project, either in cash or in kind. In-kind contributions
1.13	may include the value of site preparation other than the public infrastructure needed

1.15	(b) The purpose of the grants made under this section is to keep or enhance jobs in
