1.3Falls; amending Laws 2010, chapter 189, section 7, subdivision 19.

1.4BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.5Section 1. Laws 2010, chapter 189, section 7, subdivision 19, is amended to read:

1.6Subd. 19. **Trail Connections**3,292,000

1.7For matching grants under Minnesota

1.8Statutes, section 85.019, subdivision 4c.

1.9\$55,000 is for a grant to Carlton County to

1.10make safety improvements on the Soo Line

1.11Trail in Moose Lake, including restoring

1.12decking, railings, and approaches of the

1.13trestles on the trail.

1.14\$512,000 is for a grant to the city of Granite

1.15Falls to renovate the Roebling suspension

1.16pedestrian bridge over the Minnesota River

1.17in Granite Falls. Notwithstanding Minnesota

1.18Statutes, section 16A.642, the bond sale

1.19authorization and appropriation of bond

1.20proceeds for this project are available until

1.21December 31, 2015.

1.22\$175,000 is for a grant to the city of Hibbing

1.23to acquire land, predesign, design, construct,

2.1 and resurface the Carey Lake Bike Trail
2.2 which follows 25th Street (Dupont Road)
2.3 east to the Carey Lake Park in Hibbing, St.
2.4 Louis County.

2.5 \$1,000,000 is for a grant to the city of
2.6 Rochester to acquire the DM&E Pine Island
2.7 spur right-of-way to connect to the Douglas
2.8 State Trail.

2.9 \$800,000 is for a grant to the Rocori Trail
2.10 Board to acquire, design, and construct phase
2.11 1 of the Rocori Trail, from Richmond to the
2.12 east side of the Sauk River into Cold Spring,
2.13 connecting the Glacial Lakes State Trail to the
2.14 Beaver Island Trail and Lake Wobegon Trail.

2.15 \$250,000 is for a grant to Stearns County
2.16 to develop the 26-mile Dairyland Trail
2.17 connecting to the Lake Wobegon Trail.

2.18 \$500,000 is for a grant to the city of Walker
2.19 for phases 2 and 3 of the Shingobee Trail
2.20 Connection to the Paul Bunyan State Trail.

2.21 For any project listed in this subdivision
2.22 that the commissioner determines is not
2.23 ready to proceed, the commissioner may
2.24 allocate that project's money to another
2.25 trail connection project in this subdivision.

2.26 The chairs of the house of representatives
2.27 and senate committees with jurisdiction
2.28 over the environment and natural resources
2.29 and legislators from the affected legislative
2.30 districts must be notified of any changes.
