1.5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.6	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 169.345, subdivision 2, is amended to read:
1.7	Subd. 2. Definitions. (a) For the purpose of section 168.021 and this section, the following
1.8	terms have the meanings given them in this subdivision.
1.9	(b) "Health professional" means a licensed physician, licensed physician assistant,
1.10	advanced practice registered nurse, licensed physical therapist, or licensed chiropractor.
1.11	(c) "Long-term certificate" means a certificate issued for a period greater than 12 months
1.12	but not greater than 71 months.
1.13	(d) "Organization certificate" means a certificate issued to an entity other than a natural
1.14	person for a period of three years.
1.15	(e) "Permit" refers to a permit that is issued for a period of 30 days, in lieu of the
1.16	certificate referred to in subdivision 3, while the application is being processed.
1.17	(f) "Physically disabled person" means a person who:
1.18	(1) because of disability cannot walk without significant risk of falling;
1.19	(2) because of disability cannot walk 200 feet without stopping to rest;
1.20	(3) because of disability cannot walk without the aid of another person, a walker, a cane,
1.21	crutches, braces, a prosthetic device, or a wheelchair;

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(4) is restricted by a respiratory disease to such an extent that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one liter;
(5) has an arterial oxygen tension (PaO₂) of less than 60 mm/Hg on room air at rest;
(6) uses portable oxygen;
(7) has a cardiac condition to the extent that the person's functional limitations are classified in severity as class III or class IV according to standards set by the American Heart Association;
(8) has lost an arm or a leg and does not have or cannot use an artificial limb; of
(9) has a disability that would be aggravated by walking 200 feet under normal environmental conditions to an extent that would be life threatening; or

2.12 (10) is legally blind.

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- 2.13 (g) "Short-term certificate" means a certificate issued for a period greater than six months
 2.14 but not greater than 12 months.
- 2.15 (h) "Six-year certificate" means a certificate issued for a period of six years.
- 2.16 (i) "Temporary certificate" means a certificate issued for a period not greater than six months.
