1.11	Subd. 1a. County community-based mental health grants. Beginning January 1, 2018,
1.12	and each year thereafter as funds are available, the commissioner of human services shall
1.13	establish grant funding criteria and award onetime grants to county boards or multiple county
1.14	boards acting jointly as regional partnerships for pilot projects to expand community-based
1.15	mental health infrastructure, provide support to people with serious and persistent mental
1.16	illnesses to live in the community, and avoid unnecessary placement in state-operated
1.17	facilities. Funds shall be awarded based on proposals and needs.
