1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2018, section 168.0185, is amended to read:
1.9	168.0185 RECORD OF VEHICLE REGISTRATION; DISCLOSURE.
1.10	(a) The commissioner shall keep a record of all registered vehicles according to (1)
1.11	registration plate number, (2) name of the registered owner, (3) make of vehicle and the
1.12	vehicle's identification number, for a vehicle so identified, or, if none, the vehicle's serial
1.13	number until the manufacturer adopts and uses a vehicle identification number.
1.14	(b) The commissioner shall furnish to any person applying for a copy of the registration,
1.15	a copy as specified in section 168.327.
1.16	(c) The commissioner shall also furnish vehicle registration records, without charge, to
1.17	chiefs of police, county sheriffs, prosecuting attorneys, and other law enforcement agencies
1.18	with the power to arrest.
1.19	(d) At the request of an applicant who is registering a motor vehicle under section 168.017
1.20	or 168.018 and who possesses a driver's license or Minnesota identification card bearing a
1.21	mental health designation under section 171.07, subdivision 20, the commissioner must
1.22	maintain information related to the mental health designation in the vehicle registration
