BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2010, section 609.255, subdivision 3, is amended to read: Subd. 3. **Unreasonable restraint of children.** A parent, legal guardian, or caretaker who intentionally subjects a child under the age of 18 years to unreasonable physical confinement or restraint by means including but not limited to, tying, locking, caging, or chaining for a prolonged period of time and in a cruel manner which is excessive under the circumstances, is guilty of unreasonable restraint of a child and may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than one year or to payment of a fine of not more than \$3,000, or both. If the confinement or restraint results in substantial demonstrable bodily harm, that person may be sentenced to imprisonment for not more than five years or to payment of not more than \$10,000, or both.

EFFECTIVE DATE. The section is effective August 1, 2012, and applies to crimes committed on or after that date.
