1.7	\$35,000 is appropriated from the general fund in fiscal year 2015 to the
1.8	commissioner of human services to develop an online training program for interested
1.9	individuals and personnel, specifically county and hospital staff and mental health
1.10	providers, to understand, clarify, and interpret the Civil Commitment Act under Minnesota
1.11	Statutes, chapter 253B, as it pertains to persons with mental illnesses. The training must
1.12	be developed in collaboration with the ombudsman for mental health and developmental
1.13	disabilities, Minnesota County Attorneys Association, National Alliance on Mental Illness
1.14	of Minnesota, Mental Health Consumer/Survivor Network of Minnesota, Mental Health
1.15	Association, Minnesota Psychiatric Society, Hennepin Commitment Defense Panel,
1.16	Minnesota Disability Law Center, Minnesota Association of Community Mental Health
1.17	Programs, and Minnesota Board of Public Defense. The purpose of the training is to
1 18	promote better clarity and interpretation of the civil commitment laws
