1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. CITATION.
1.6	This act may be cited as the "Producing Lucrative Agriculture with New Technologies
1.7	Act (PLANT Act)."
1.8	Sec. 2. PLANT-BASED FOOD RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT PILOT
1.9	PROGRAM.
1.10	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The commissioner of agriculture shall establish and
1.11	administer a plant-based food research and development pilot grant program. The
1.12	commissioner shall award competitive grants to eligible entities for activities, as described
1.13	in subdivision 2, that support research focused on creating foods with the same characteristics
1.14	as animal-based meat using plants.
1.15	Subd. 2. Activities. Eligible grant activities include:
1.16	(1) characterization of functional properties, breeding efforts, scalability, environmental
1.17	sustainability, and nutrition of plant proteins and crop-based sidestreams for use as ingredients
1.18	in plant-based foods;
1.19	(2) development of new and standardized high-throughput screening and analytical
1.20	methods to measure the usefulness of crops and their components in plant-based foods;

ingredients	more functional, palatable, affordable, and scalable when producing plant-based
foods; and	
<u>(4) innc</u>	ovation in plant-based food end product manufacturing processes, including

<u>Subd.</u> 3	. Report. No later than January 15, 2025, the commissioner of agriculture must

Sec. 4. <u>P</u>	LANT-BASED FOODS PRODUCTION TRAINING PILOT PROGRAM.
The cor	nmissioner of agriculture shall establish and administer a plant-based foods
production	training pilot grant program to award grants to secondary career and technical
education p	rograms and institutions of higher education for the purpose of offering instruction
n plant-ba	sed food production. The commissioner shall give priority to institutions that
coordinate	with local producers of plant-based foods. Grants may be used for costs, including
but not lim	ited to:
<u>(1) equi</u>	ipment required to produce plant-based foods;
<u>(2) faci</u>	lity renovation to accommodate plant-based food production; and
(3) trait	ning faculty to teach the fundamentals of plant-based food production.

3.1	Sec. 5. APPROPRIATION.
3.2	\$3,000,000 in fiscal year 2023 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner
3.3	of agriculture for the purposes of this act. This is a onetime appropriation and is available
3.4	until June 30, 2024. Of this amount:
3.5	(1) \$2,000,000 is for the plant-based food research and development pilot program in
3.6	section 2;
3.7	(2) \$500,000 is for the plant-based food workforce scholarships pilot program in section
3.8	<u>3; and</u>
3.9	(3) \$500,000 is for plant-based foods production training grants under section 4.
3.10	Sec. 6. EFFECTIVE DATE; EXPIRATION.
3.11	This act is effective the day following final enactment and expires January 15, 2025.
