1.8	(a) The commissioner of human services, in consultation with the commissioners of
1.9	commerce and health, shall study why traditional two-parent families, especially families
1.10	with children, are disproportionately underrepresented in Minnesota's social services
1.11	programs, including but not limited to MFIP, general assistance, MinnesotaCare, and
1.12	MNsure. The commissioner shall report findings and make legislative recommendations
1.13	on the following:
1.14	(1) barriers to traditional two-parent families to access social services programs;
1.15	(2) specific ways social services programs can support traditional two-parent families;
1.16	(3) methods by which local social service agencies can provide support to traditional
1.17	two-parent families;
1.18	(4) incentives for social service recipients to transition out of social services
1.19	programs;
