1.6	Section 1. [129E.01] LEGISLATIVE FINDING; ORCHESTRA.		
1.7	The legislature determines that:		
1.8	(1) having a world-renowned orchestra is an important asset to the state of		
1.9	Minnesota and ensuring that such a highly acclaimed orchestra is present in Minnesota		
1.10	is an important public purpose;		
1.11	(2) providing broad-based community governance of an orchestra develops trust		
1.12	among patrons, taxpayers, and the orchestra's musicians and other staff and helps ensure		
1.13	this important asset will retain its high level of accomplishment and renown; and		
1.14	(3) enacting legislation providing for community governance indicates to musicians		
1.15	continuing support for a world-renowned orchestra in Minnesota.		
1.16	Sec. 2. [129E.02] GOVERNANCE; MINNESOTA ORCHESTRA.		
1.17	The Minnesota Orchestra is encouraged to restructure its governance to create a		
1.18	membership-based governance structure. Under this governance structure:		
1.19	(1) any person paying the annual dues specified in the governing documents of the		
1.20	association would be entitled to elect the board of directors of the association;		
1.21	(2) the bylaws of the association would include specific duties for the board and the		
1.22	officers and would specify conditions under which the board or officers could be removed		
1.23	by the membership; and
