Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 3.3005, subdivision 4, is amended to read: 2.3 Subd. 4. Interim procedures; urgencies. If federal money becomes available 2.4 is awarded to the state for expenditure after the deadline in subdivision 2 or while the 2.5 legislature is not in session, and the availability of money from that source or for that 2.6 purpose or in that fiscal year could not reasonably have been anticipated and included in 2.7 the governor's budget request, and an urgency requires that all or part of the money be 2.8 allotted encumbered or expended before the legislature reconvenes or prior to the end of 2.9 the 20-day period specified in subdivision 2, it may be allotted to a state agency after the 2.10 requirements of subdivision 5 are met. Legislative Advisory Commission has reviewed 2.11 the request. If the members of the commission make a positive recommendation or no 2.12 recommendation, or if the commission has not reviewed the request within ten days after 2.13 the date the request was submitted, the commissioner may approve the request and the 2.14 federal money may be allotted for expenditure. If the commission makes a negative 2.15 recommendation or a recommendation for further review on a request within ten days after 2.16 the date the request was submitted, the commissioner shall not approve the expenditure of 2.17 the federal money. Federal money that is awarded 2.28 and becomes available under subdivision 3, 3a, or 3b, or 4 may be allotted after the 2.29 commissioner of management and budget has submitted the request to the members of 2.30 the Legislative Advisory Commission for their review and recommendation for further 2.31 review. If a recommendation is not made within ten days, no further review by the 2.32 Legislative Advisory Commission is required, and the commissioner shall approve or 2.33 disapprove the request. If a recommendation by any member is for further review the 2.34

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governor shall submit the request to the Legislative Advisory Commission for its review 3.1 and recommendation. Failure or refusal of the commission to make a recommendation 3.2 promptly is a negative recommendation. If a member of the commission makes a negative 3.3 recommendation or requests further review on a request within 20 days after the date 3.4 the request was submitted, the commissioner shall not approve the expenditure of that 3.5 federal money. Sec. 6. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 3.3005, subdivision 6, is amended to read: 3.11 Subd. 6. Interim procedures; nonurgencies. If federal money is awarded and 3.12 becomes available to the state for expenditure after the deadline in subdivision 2 or while 3.13 the legislature is not in session, and subdivision 4 does not apply, a request to expend the 3.14 that federal money may be submitted by the commissioner of management and budget to 3.15 members of the Legislative Advisory Commission for their review and recommendation. 3.16 This request must be submitted by the later of October 1 of any year or 100 days before the 3.17 start of the next legislative session. If any member of the commission makes a negative 3.18 recommendation or a recommendation for further review on a request by October 20 of 3.19 the same year during the 20-day period beginning the day the commissioner submits 3.20 the request, the commissioner shall not approve expenditure of that federal money. If a 3.21 3.22 request to expend federal money submitted under this subdivision receives a negative recommendation or a recommendation for further review, the commissioner shall not 3.23 approve the request until the request may be submitted again under subdivision 2. 16E.0466 STATE AGENCY TECHNOLOGY PROJECTS.

(a) Every state agency with an information or telecommunications project must 4.3 consult with the Office of MN.IT Services to determine the information technology cost 4.4 of the project. Upon agreement between the commissioner of a particular agency and 4.5 the chief information officer, the agency must transfer the information technology cost 4.6 portion of the project to the Office of MN.IT Services. Service level agreements must 4.7 document all project-related transfers under this section. Those agencies specified in 4.8 section 16E.016, paragraph (d), are exempt from the requirements of this section. 4.9 (b) Notwithstanding section 16A.28, subdivision 3, any unexpended operating 4.10 balance appropriated to a state agency may be transferred to the information and 4.11 telecommunications technology systems and services account for the information 4.12 technology cost of a specific project, subject to the review of the Legislative Advisory 4.13 Commission, under section 16E.21, subdivision 3. 4.14
