1.5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 86B.005, subdivision 8a, is amended to read:

1.7 Subd. 8a. **Marine carbon monoxide detection system.** "Marine carbon monoxide

1.8 detection system" means a device or system ~~that meets the requirements of the American~~

1.9 ~~Boat and Yacht Council Standard A-24, July, 2015, for carbon monoxide detection systems.~~

1.10 for detecting carbon monoxide that is certified by a nationally recognized testing laboratory

1.11 to conform to current UL Standards for use on recreational boats.

1.12 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective the day following final enactment.

1.13 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 86B.532, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

1.14 Subdivision 1. **Requirements; installation.** (a) No motorboat used for recreational

1.15 purposes that has an enclosed accommodation compartment may be operated on any waters

1.16 of the state unless the motorboat is equipped with a functioning marine carbon monoxide

1.17 detection system installed according to the manufacturer's instructions and this subdivision.

1.18 (b) ~~After May 1, 2017,~~ No new motorboat used for recreational purposes that has an

1.19 enclosed accommodation compartment may be sold or offered for sale in Minnesota unless

1.20 the motorboat is equipped with a new functioning marine carbon monoxide detection system

1.21 installed according to the manufacturer's instructions and this subdivision.

1.22 (c) A marine carbon monoxide detection system must be located:

- 2.1 (1) to monitor the atmosphere of the main cabin of the enclosed accommodation
2.2 compartment; and
- 2.3 (2) in each sleeping accommodation or within ten feet or 3.048 meters of any designated
2.4 sleeping accommodations.
- 2.5 **EFFECTIVE DATE.** This section is effective May 1, 2018.
