	Section 1. [116L.36] GRANTS PROHIBITED TO NONPROFIT ORGANIZATIONS
7	WITH HIGHLY COMPENSATED OFFICERS OR EMPLOYEES.
	(a) A nonprofit organization that compensates an officer or employee in an amount
٤	greater than 125 percent of the governor's salary in a 12-month period is not eligible to
1	eceive a grant under any economic development or workforce development program
2	dministered or overseen by the commissioner in the first fiscal year beginning, during, or
2	after that 12-month period or in the following fiscal year.
	(b) The salary limit in paragraph (a) must be adjusted annually on January 1. The new
1	imit must equal the limit for the prior year increased by the percentage increase, if any, in
<u>t</u>	he Consumer Price Index for all urban consumers from October of the second prior year
t	o October of the immediately prior year.
	(c) Compensation for purposes of this section includes salary, bonuses, the present value
(	of stock options, the value of employee benefits, employer contributions to retirement or
(	leferred compensation plans on behalf of the officer or employee, and any other
(	compensation or benefit of value.
	(d) This section does not apply to performance grants administered under section
