1.5	Section 1. TRAUMA-INFORMED JURY SELECTION PILOT PROJECT.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Definition. As used in this section, "trauma-informed" means recognizing
1.7	a person's history of severe mental or physical harms and stresses and responding to that
1.8	history by promoting a safe and empowering environment.
1.9	Subd. 2. Establishment. The supreme court shall establish a trauma-informed jury
1.10	selection project in County, County, and County to identify and implement
1.11	trauma-informed procedures and practices to prepare jurors for potentially difficult
1.12	experiences, reduce the likelihood of retraumatization, ameliorate stress and trauma triggered
1.13	in the jury selection process, and ensure a fair and impartial jury.
1.14	Subd. 3. Program components. (a) The supreme court, in consultation with the senior
