1.8	damages against the Board of Regents if the Board of Regents required the student or
1.9	employee to receive an immunization and the student or employee experienced serious
1.10	illness or injury as a result of the immunization. The court shall award actual damages and
1.11	reasonable attorney fees and costs to a prevailing plaintiff.
1.12	(b) For the purposes of this section, "employee" has the meaning given in section 181.950,
1.13	subdivision 6, and includes an unpaid intern or volunteer treated as an employee for purposes
