1.6	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.7	Section 1. [144.1507] GRANTS PROGRAM FOR MENTAL HEALTH TRAINING
1.8	FOR PEDIATRIC PRIMARY CARE PROVIDERS.
1.9	Subdivision 1. Establishment. (a) The commissioner of health shall award grants for
1.10	the development of child mental health training programs that are located in outpatient
1.11	primary care clinics. To be eligible for a grant, a training program must:
1.12	(1) focus on the training of pediatric primary care providers working with
1.13	multidisciplinary mental health teams;
1.14	(2) provide training on conducting comprehensive clinical mental health assessments
1.15	and potential pharmacological therapy;
1.16	(3) provide psychiatric consultation to pediatric primary care providers during their
1.17	outpatient pediatric primary care experiences;
1.18	(4) emphasize longitudinal care for patients with behavioral health needs; and
1.19	(5) develop partnerships with community resources.
1.20	Subd. 2. Child mental health training grant program. (a) Child mental health training
1.21	grants may be awarded to eligible primary care training programs to plan and implement
1 22	new programs or expand existing programs in child mental health training.

2.7	Subd. 3. Applications for child mental health training grants. Eligible primary care
2.8	training programs seeking a grant shall apply to the commissioner. Applications must include

.10	associated with the training program; all sources of funds for the training program; detailed
.11	uses of all funds for the training program; the results expected; and a plan to maintain the
.12	training program after the grant period. The applicant must describe achievable objectives,
13	and a timetable for the training program.
14	Subd. 4. Consideration of child mental health training grant applications. The
15	commissioner shall review each application to determine whether or not the application
16	meets the stated goals of the grant and shall award grants to support up to four training
7	program proposals.
8	Subd. 5. <b>Program oversight.</b> During the grant period, the commissioner may require
19	and collect from grantees any information necessary to evaluate the training program.

21	\$1,000,000 is appropriated in fiscal year 2023 from the general fund to the commissioner
22	of health for the mental health training programs for pediatric primary care providers under
23	Minnesota Statutes, section 144.1507.
