1.6	Section 1. [121A.24] LICENSED SCHOOL COUNSELORS.
1.7	Subdivision 1. Counselors. A school district shall provide adequate school
1.8	counseling services to its students. A school district may directly employ or contract
1.9	for licensed school counselors.
1.10	Subd. 2. Ratio. For the 2016-2017 school year and later, the ratio of students to
1.11	licensed school counselors must not exceed 400 enrolled students in kindergarten through
1.12	grade 12 per licensed school counselor. In any year, a school district's ratio may exceed
1.13	this amount by up to 20 percent, provided that the five-year average does not exceed the
