1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2012, section 332A.02, subdivision 8, is amended to read:
1.9	Subd. 8. Debt management services provider. "Debt management services
1.10	provider" means any person offering or providing debt management services to a debtor
1.11	domiciled in this state, regardless of whether or not a fee is charged for the services and
1.12	regardless of whether the person maintains a physical presence in the state. This term
1.13	includes any person to whom debt management services are delegated, and does not
1.14	include services performed by the following when engaged in the regular course of their
1.15	respective businesses and professions:
1.16	(1) <u>exempt</u> attorneys at law, escrow agents, accountants, broker-dealers in securities;
1.17	(2) state or national banks, credit unions, trust companies, savings associations,
1.18	title insurance companies, insurance companies, and all other lending institutions duly
1.19	authorized to transact business in Minnesota;
1.20	(3) persons who, as employees on a regular salary or wage of an employer not
1.21	engaged in the business of debt management, perform credit services for their employer;
1.22	(4) public officers acting in their official capacities and persons acting as a debt

5.16	(1) for fees calculated on a percentage of debt basis, 15 percent of the aggregate
5.17	debt; and
5.18	(2) for fees calculated on a percentage of savings basis, 30 percent of the savings
5.19	actually negotiated by the debt settlement services provider. The savings shall be
5.20	calculated as the difference between the aggregate debt that is stated in the debt settlement
5.21	services agreement at the time of its execution and the total amount that the debtor actually
5.22	pays to settle all the debts included in the debt settlement services agreement, provided
5.23	that only savings resulting from concessions actually negotiated by the debt settlement
5.24	services provider may be counted.
5.25	Subd. 3. Fees as a percentage of savings Collection of fees. (a) The total amount
5.26	of the fees claimed, demanded, charged, collected, or received under this subdivision
5.27	shall be calculated as 30 percent of the savings actually negotiated by the debt settlement
5.28	services provider. The savings shall be calculated as the difference between the aggregate
5.29	debt that is stated in the debt settlement services agreement at the time of its execution
5.30	and total amount that the debtor actually pays to settle all the debts stated in the debt
5.31	settlement services agreement, provided that only savings resulting from concessions
5.32	actually negotiated by the debt settlement services provider may be counted. A debt
5.33	settlement services provider that calculates fees as a percentage of savings may:
5.34	(1) charge an origination fee, which may be designated by the debt settlement
5.35	services provider as nonrefundable, of:
5.36	(i) \$300 on aggregate debt of less than \$20,000; or

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6.1	(ii) \$500 on aggregate debt of \$20,000 or more;
6.2	(2) charge a monthly fee of:
6.3	(i) no greater than \$65 on aggregate debt of less than \$40,000; and
6.4	(ii) no greater than \$75 on aggregate debt of \$40,000 or more; and
6.5	(3) charge a settlement fee for the remainder of the allowable fees, which may be
6.6	demanded and collected no earlier than upon delivery to the debt settlement services
6.7	provider by a creditor of a bona fide, final written settlement offer consistent with the
6.8	terms of the debt settlement services agreement. A settlement fee may be assessed for each
6.9	debt settled, but the sum total of the origination fee, the monthly fee, and the settlement
6.10	fee may not exceed 30 percent of the savings, as calculated under paragraph (a).
6.11	(b) The collection of monthly fees shall cease under this subdivision when the
6.12	total of monthly fees and the origination fee equals 50 percent of the total fees allowable
6.13	under this subdivision. For the purposes of this subdivision, 50 percent of the total fees
6.14	allowable shall assume a settlement of 50 cents on the dollar.
6.15	(c) In no event may more than 50 percent of the total amount of fees allowable be
6.16	elaimed, demanded, charged, collected, or received by a debt settlement services provider
6.17	any earlier than upon delivery to the debt settlement services provider by a creditor of a
6.18	bona fide, final written settlement offer consistent with the terms of the debt settlement
6.19	services agreement.
6.20	A debt settlement services provider may not impose or collect any payment pursuant
6.21	to a debt settlement services agreement before the debt settlement service provider has
6.22	fully performed all of the following:
6.23	(1) the debt settlement services contained in the agreement; and
6.24	(2) any additional services the debt settlement services provider has agreed to
6.25	perform.
6.26	If more than one debt is the subject of the debt settlement services agreement, a
6.27	debt settlement services provider may only charge or collect that proportion of total fees
6.28	allowable under this section that equals the proportion of the aggregate debt the individual
6.29	settled debt represents.
6.30	Subd. 4. Fees exclusive. No fees, charges, assessments, or any other compensation
6.31	may be claimed, demanded, charged, collected, or received other than the fees allowed
6.32	under this section. Any fees collected in excess of those allowed under this section must
6.33	be immediately returned to the debtor.
6.34	Subd. 5. Withdrawal of creditor. Whenever a creditor withdraws from a debt
6.35	settlement services plan, the debt settlement services provider must promptly notify the
6.36	debtor of the withdrawal, identify the creditor, and inform the debtor of the right to modify
