1.5	Section 1. [604.055] WAIVER OF LIABILITY FOR NEGLIGENT CONDUCT.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Certain agreements are void and unenforceable. An agreement
1.7	between parties for a consumer service, including a recreational activity, that purports to
1.8	release, limit, or waive the liability of one party for damage, injuries, or death resulting
