1.7	Section 1. [116L.667] RURAL WORKFORCE SYSTEM COORDINATORS.			
1.8	Subdivision 1. Requirement. Each workforce service center, except for a service			
1.9	center that serves a single city, located outside of the metropolitan area, as defined			
1.10	in section 473.121, subdivision 2, must have a workforce system coordinator who is			
1.11	responsible for improving coordination and communication of workforce development			
1.12	programs and services within the workforce service area, with other workforce service			
1.13	areas and system coordinators, and with administering agencies. A workforce system			
1.14	coordinator may serve as the coordinator for up to two service areas.			
1.15	Subd. 2. Responsibilities. A workforce system coordinator is responsible for:			
1.16	(1) assisting existing, new, and prospective service area businesses in determining			
1.17	applicable workforce development programs, resources, and other services;			
1.18	(2) connecting job seekers, secondary and higher education institutions, employers,			
1.19	and other stakeholders and partners;
