A bill for an act 1.1 relating to game and fish; prohibiting trapping and baiting wolves; prohibiting 12 use of snares to take wild animals; providing criminal penalties; amending 1.3 Minnesota Statutes 2014, sections 97A.075, subdivision 7; 97A.331, subdivision 1.4 6; 97A.475, subdivision 20; 97B.085, subdivision 3; 97B.647, subdivisions 1, 1.5 2, 5, 6, 7, by adding subdivisions; 97B.928, subdivision 1; 97B.951; proposing 1.6 coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 97B; repealing Minnesota 1.7 Statutes 2014, section 97B.421. 1.8

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
- 1.10 Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 97A.075, subdivision 7, is amended to read:
- 1.11 Subd. 7. **Wolf licenses; account established.** (a) For purposes of this subdivision,
  1.12 "wolf license" means a license or permit issued under section 97A.475, subdivision 2,
  1.13 clause (20); or 3, paragraph (a), clause (16); or 20, paragraph (b).
  - (b) A wolf management and monitoring account is created in the game and fish fund. Revenue from wolf licenses must be credited to the wolf management and monitoring account and is appropriated to the commissioner only for wolf management, research, damage control, enforcement, and education.
- 1.18 Sec. 2. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 97A.331, subdivision 6, is amended to read:
- Subd. 6. **Pine marten; otter; fisher; wolf; wolverine.** A person that takes, transports, or possesses pine marten, otter, fisher, wolf, or wolverine in violation of the game and fish laws is guilty of a gross misdemeanor.

- Subd. 20. **Trapping licenses.** (a) The fee for a license to trap fur-bearing animals,

2.28	Subd. 6. Application for license. An application for a wolf hunting or wolf trapping
2.29	license must be made in a manner provided by the commissioner and accompanied by a

2.31	license. The \$4 application fee shall be credited to the wolf management and monitoring

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account and appropriated to the commissioner to pay for costs associated with conducting 3.1 the wolf license drawing and wolf management. A person may not make more than 3.2 one application for each season as prescribed by the commissioner. If a person makes 3.3 more than one application, the person is ineligible for a license for that season after 3.4 determination by the commissioner, without a hearing. 3.5 Sec. 9. [97B.649] BAITING WOLVES PROHIBITED. 3.20 Subdivision 1. Hunting wolves with aid of bait prohibited. A person may not take 3.21 3.22 a wolf with the aid or use of bait. Subd. 2. Removal of bait. An area is considered baited for ten days after the 3.23 complete removal of all bait. 3.24 Subd. 3. **Definition.** (a) For purposes of this section, "bait" includes meat, bones, 3.25 fat, an animal carcass, or other food that is capable of attracting or enticing wolves and that 3.26 has been placed by a person. "Baiting" means placing, exposing, depositing, distributing, 3.27 or scattering bait that is capable of attracting or enticing wolves. 3.28 (b) Liquid scents, salts, and minerals are not bait if they do not contain liquid 3.29 or solid food ingredients. 3.30 (c) Agricultural crops or livestock from normal or accepted farming, forest 3.31

management, wildlife food plantings, orchard management, or other similar land

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4.1	management activities are not bait. This exclusion does not apply to agricultural crops or
4.2	livestock that have been reintroduced and concentrated where a person is hunting.
4.3	Subd. 4. Exception for bait or feed on adjacent land. A person otherwise in
4.4	compliance with this section who is hunting on private or public property that is adjacent
4.5	to property where bait or food is present is not in violation of this section if the person
4.6	has not participated in, been involved with, or agreed to baiting or feeding wildlife on the
4.7	adjacent property.

4.13	(1) the number and state of the person's driver's license;
4.14	(2) the person's Minnesota identification card number;

4.16	(4) the license identification number issued by the Department of Natural Resources.

## 97B.421 PERMIT REQUIRED TO SNARE BEARS.

A person may not use a snare to take a bear except under a permit from the commissioner.
