1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. CIVIL COMMITMENT TASK FORCE.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. The Supreme Court is requested to establish a task force
1.7	to evaluate state civil commitment laws and procedures and related legal and treatment
1.8	issues under Minnesota Statutes, chapter 253B.
1.9	Subd. 2. Membership. (a) The task force shall consist of 24 members and shall include:
1.10	(1) legal practitioners including at least one judge, a county attorney, a representative
1.11	of the attorney general's office, and an attorney who represents individuals with mental
1.12	illness in commitment proceedings;
1.13	(2) parents or other family members of individuals with mental illnesses who have been
1.14	committed;
1.15	(3) a representative from a mental health advocacy group;
1.16	(4) individuals with mental illnesses who have and have not been committed;
1.17	(5) mental health service providers, including but not limited to hospitals;
1.18	(6) representatives of county agencies;
1.19	(7) representatives of the Department of Human Services Policy and Operations and
1.20	Direct Care and Treatment Divisions;
