BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

Section 1. [363A.111] TV CAPTIONING REQUIRED.

Each place of public accommodation located within the state must enable open captioning on any television or other audiovisual display capable of captioning at all times that it uses television or other audiovisual displays to provide information or entertainment to the public. The captions must be high-contrast to the extent feasible. Whenever a place of public accommodation acquires a new television or audiovisual display technology, it must acquire one with high-contrast captioning capability.
