1.5BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.6Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2016, section 609.50, is amended to read:

1.7**609.50 OBSTRUCTING LEGAL PROCESS, ARREST, EMERGENCY**

1.8**RESPONSE, OR FIREFIGHTING.**

1.9Subdivision 1. **Crime.** Whoever ~~intentionally~~ knowingly does any of the following may

1.10be sentenced as provided in subdivision 2:

1.11(1) obstructs, hinders, or prevents the lawful execution of any legal process, civil or

1.12criminal, or apprehension of another on a charge or conviction of a criminal offense;

1.13(2) obstructs, resists, or interferes with a peace officer or reserve officer while the officer

1.14is engaged in the performance of official duties;

1.15(3) interferes with or obstructs a firefighter while the firefighter is engaged in the

1.16performance of official duties;

1.17(4) interferes with or obstructs a member of an ambulance service personnel crew, as

1.18defined in section 144E.001, subdivision 3a, an emergency medical technician, as defined

1.19in section 144E.001, subdivision 5c, a physician, or a nurse who is providing, or attempting

1.20to provide, emergency care; or

(5) by force or threat of force endeavors to obstruct any employee of the Department of Revenue while the employee is lawfully engaged in the performance of official duties for the purpose of deterring or interfering with the performance of those duties.

Subd. 2. **Penalty.** A person convicted of violating subdivision 1 ~~may~~ is guilty of a felony and shall be sentenced as follows:

(1) if (i) the person knew or had reason to know that the act created a risk of death, substantial bodily harm, or serious property damage; or (ii) the act caused death, substantial bodily harm, or serious property damage; to imprisonment for not more than five years ~~or~~, but no less than 24 months, and to payment of a fine of not more than \$10,000, ~~or both; or~~

~~(2) if the act was accompanied by force or violence or the threat thereof, and is not otherwise covered by clause (1), to imprisonment for not more than one year or to payment of a fine of not more than \$3,000, or both; or~~

~~(3)~~ (2) in other cases, to imprisonment for not ~~more than 90 days or~~ less than 12 months and to payment of a fine of not more than \$1,000, ~~or both~~ \$10,000.

Subd. 3. **Title.** This section shall be cited as the "Minnesota Public Safety Personnel Protection Act."
