1.11	provide information according to this section to students who are parents of one or more
1.12	children age 12 or younger, and to students who notify the institution that they are pregnant.
1.13	The information must include a fact sheet on the legal rights of student parents and pregnant
1.14	students and a list of resources to support student parents and pregnant students. The list of
1.15	resources may include resources for prenatal care, child care, transportation, and housing.
