## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

## Section 1. APPROPRIATION.

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- (a) \$..... in fiscal year 2020 and \$..... in fiscal year 2021 are appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of human services for grants to organizations to support the organizations' parent-to-parent programs for families of children and youth with special health care needs. This is a onetime appropriation.
- (b) Eligible organizations must have an established parent-to-parent program that conducts outreach and support to newly identified parents or guardians of a child or youth with special health care needs; that provides training to educate parents and guardians in ways to support their child and navigate the health, education, and human services systems; that facilitates ongoing peer support for parents and guardians from trained volunteer support parents; and that communicates regularly with other parent-to-parent programs and national organizations to ensure best practices are implemented.
  - (c) Grant recipients must use grant funds for the purposes in paragraph (b).
- (d) For the purposes of this section, "special health care needs" means disabilities, chronic 1.18 illnesses or conditions, health-related educational or behavioral problems, or the risk of 1.19 developing disabilities, conditions, illnesses, or problems. 1.20
- (e) Grant recipients must report to the commissioner of human services annually by 1.21 January 15 on the services and programs funded by the appropriation. The report must 1.22
