(a) Notwithstanding any law to the contrary, a peace 1.6 officer who, under color of law, subjects or causes to be subjected, including but not limited 1.7 to failing to intervene, another person to the deprivation of any rights, privileges, or 1.8 1.9 immunities granted to the person under the constitutions and laws of the United States and this state, is liable to the injured party for compensatory damages, punitive damages, equitable 1.10 relief, or any other appropriate relief. If the plaintiff prevails in the action, in addition to 1.11 any monetary or injunctive relief, the court may award reasonable attorney fees and costs. 1.12 If the defendant prevails in the action, the court may award reasonable attorney fees and 1.13 costs if the court finds the claim to have been frivolous. 1.14 (b) Statutory immunities and statutory limitations on liability, damages, and attorney 1.15 fees shall not apply to claims brought under this subdivision.
