1.5	Section 1. APPROPRIATION; PEER-RUN RESPITE SERVICES.
1.6	Subdivision 1. <b>Definitions.</b> (a) For the purposes of this section, the following terms have
1.7	the meaning given.
1.8	(b) "Arrowhead Adult Mental Health Region" includes the counties of: Carlton, Cook,
1.9	Itasca, Koochiching, Lake, and St. Louis, and the following tribes: Bois Forte (Nett Lake)
1.10	Band, Fond du Lac Band, and Grand Portage Band.
1.11	(c) "Peer-run respite organization" means a support service center that is owned, operated,
1.12	and administrated by persons with lived experiences of mental health or substance use
1.13	disorders and that is based in the community.
1.14	(d) "Region V+ Adult Mental Health Initiative" includes the counties of: Aitkin, Cass,
1.15	Crow Wing, Morrison, Todd, and Wadena, and the following tribes: Leech Lake Band and

1.17	Subd. 2. Appropriation. (a) \$1,480,000 in fiscal year 2020 is appropriated from the
