4.18	Sec. 4. REVISOR INSTRUCTION.
4.19	By March 1, 2025, the revisor of statutes must submit to the chairs and ranking minority
4.20	members of the legislative committees and divisions with jurisdiction over environment
4.21	and natural resources policy and finance draft legislation with the statutory changes necessary
4.22	to implement this act.
