1.7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:

1.8	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2014, section 124D.09, subdivision 10, is amended to
1.9	read:
1.10	Subd. 10. Courses according to agreements. (a) An eligible pupil, according to
1.11	subdivision 5, may enroll in a developmental course under paragraph (b) or nonsectarian
1.12	course taught by a secondary teacher or a postsecondary faculty member and offered at
1.13	a secondary school, or another location, according to an agreement between a public
1.14	school board and the governing body of an eligible public postsecondary system or an
1.15	eligible private postsecondary institution, as defined in subdivision 3. All provisions of
1.16	this section shall apply to a pupil, public school board, district, and the governing body of
1.17	a postsecondary institution, except as otherwise provided.
1.18	(b) Notwithstanding subdivision 9, paragraph (b), a public school board and
1.19	the governing body of an eligible public postsecondary system may agree to offer
1.20	developmental courses under this subdivision. Notwithstanding subdivision 12, no
1.21	postsecondary credit may be granted for a developmental course taken under this
1.22	subdivision. A developmental course must:

3.7	Subd. 5. Report. (a) The board must annually report by February 1 to the chairs and
3.8	ranking minority members of the legislative committees with primary jurisdiction over
3.9	higher education policy with the following information from the previous academic year
3.10	for each system campus:
3.11	(1) the number of students participating in the supplemental instruction program;
3.12	(2) the number of students that received credit in a supplemental instruction course;
3.13	(3) the graduation rate of students enrolling in a supplemental instruction course, if
3.14	available;
3.15	(4) the graduation rate of students not enrolling in a supplemental instruction course;
3.16	(5) the amount of time, on average, that it takes a student enrolling in a supplemental
3.17	instruction course to graduate, if available;
3.18	(6) the amount of time, on average, that it takes a student not enrolling in a
3.19	supplemental instruction course to graduate; and
3.20	(7) the date of graduation and the name and location of the secondary school,
3.21	including the charter school from which the student graduated, or whether the student
3.22	received a general education diploma or was homeschooled.
3.23	(b) The board shall provide, for each reporting requirement under paragraph (a),
3.24	clauses (1) to (7), a breakdown of the student data by race and ethnicity.
3.25	EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment.
3.26	The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities must begin
3.27	offering a supplemental instruction program at each Minnesota State College and
3.28	University campus by the beginning of the 2018-2019 academic year.
