1.6	Section 1. [119B.195] RETAINING EARLY EDUCATORS THROUGH ATTAINING
1.7	INCENTIVES NOW (REETAIN) GRANT PROGRAM.
1.8	Subdivision 1. Establishment; purpose. The retaining early educators through attaining
1.9	incentives now (REETAIN) grant program is established to provide competitive grants to
1.10	incentivize well-trained child care professionals to remain in the workforce. The overall
1.11	goal of the REETAIN grant program is to create more consistent care for children over time.
1.12	Subd. 2. Administration. The commissioner shall allocate grant money to child care
1.13	resource and referral agencies to administer the REETAIN grant program. Up to ten percent
