1.4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:
1.5	Section 1. SCHOOL SAFETY LEGISLATIVE STUDY GROUP.
1.6	Subdivision 1. Establishment. A legislative study group is established to make
1.7	recommendations to address school safety issues.
1.8	Subd. 2. Members. (a) The legislative study group on school safety consists of:
1.9	(1) six duly elected and currently serving members of the house of representatives, three
1.10	appointed by the speaker of the house and three appointed by the house minority leader,
1.11	one of whom must be the current chair of the house of representatives committee with
1.12	jurisdiction over education policy; and
1.13	(2) six duly elected and currently serving senators, three appointed by the senate majority
1.14	leader and three appointed by the senate minority leader, one of whom must be the current
1.15	chair of the senate committee with jurisdiction over education policy.
1.16	(b) The appointments must be made by July 1, 2023, and expire January 31, 2024.
1.17	(c) If a vacancy occurs, the leader of the caucus in the house of representatives or senate
1.18	to which the vacating study group member belonged must fill the vacancy.
1.19	Subd. 3. Duties. (a) The legislative study group must prepare a report to the legislature
1.20	making recommendations on ways to improve school safety. In preparing the
1.21	recommendations, the group must consider the following:

2.9	no later than August 1, 2023. The study group must meet periodically.						
2.10	(b) Meetings of the study group are subject to Minnesota Statutes, chapter 13D.						
2.11	(c) The study group must elect a chair or chairs from among the members present at the

2.13	Subd. 5. Administrative support. The Legislative Coordinating Commission must
