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A bill for an act relating to public safety; establishing a task force to review and evaluate the standards and training of school resource officers and the relationship between schools and officers; requiring a report.	
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MINNESOTA:	
Section 1. SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS TASK FORCE.	
Subdivision 1. Establishment. The School Resource Officers Task Force	
is established to identify, review, evaluate, and recommend standards and training	
requirements for school resource officers.	
Subd. 2. Membership; meetings; staff. (a) The task force shall be composed of	
22 members:	
(1) the director of the Minnesota School Safety Center;	
(2) the commissioner of education or the commissioner's designee;	
(3) one member appointed by the Board of Peace Officer Standards and Training;	
(4) one sheriff appointed by the governor;	
(5) one peace officer appointed by the Minnesota Chiefs of Police Association;	
(6) one school administrator appointed by the Minnesota Association of School	
Administrators;	
(7) two school resource officers appointed by the Minnesota Police and Peace	
Officers Association;	
(8) two licensed teachers, one from a traditional kindergarten through grade 12	

public school setting and one from an intermediate school district or public alternative

(9) one school counselor appointed by the Minnesota School Counselors Association;

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learning center or program, appointed by Education Minnesota;

2.1	(10) one attorney appointed by the Minnesota Disability Law Center;
2.2	(11) one licensed practitioner appointed by the National Association of Mental
2.3	Illness Minnesota;
2.4	(12) one elementary school principal appointed by the Minnesota Elementary
2.5	School Principals' Association;
2.6	(13) one secondary school principal appointed by the Minnesota Association of
2.7	Secondary School Principals;
2.8	(14) one member appointed by the governor representing the Minnesota Native
2.9	American community;
2.10	(15) one member appointed by the governor representing the Minnesota
2.11	African-American community;
2.12	(16) one member appointed by the governor representing the Minnesota Latino

2.14	(17) one member appointed by the governor representing the Minnesota
2.15	Asian-Pacific community; and
2.16	(18) three students or recent students who have graduated from a Minnesota
2.17	public high school within five years of the effective date of this act, one each from a
2.18	rural, suburban, and urban area of the state, appointed by the Juvenile Justice Advisory
2.19	Committee.
2.20	(b) Members must be appointed by the appointing authority by July 1, 2016, and
2.21	serve at the pleasure of the appointing authority. A vacancy shall be filled by appointment
2.22	of the appointing authority for the vacating member.
2.23	(c) The commissioner of public safety, at the request of the task force, shall provide
2.24	staff and technical assistance necessary for the task force to carry out its duties.
2.25	(d) The director of the Minnesota School Safety Center shall convene the first
2.26	meeting of the task force by August 1, 2016. The task force shall elect a chair from its
2.27	members at the first meeting.
2.28	(e) The Department of Public Safety may use existing resources to compensate
2.29	members of the task force under Minnesota Statutes, section 15.059, subdivision 3.
2.30	Subd. 3. Duties. (a) The duties of the task force shall, at a minimum, include:
2.31	(1) recommending strategies to increase diversity among school resource officers by
2.32	considering how to assign school resource officers so that the demographic characteristics
2.33	of the officer reflect the demographic characteristics of the majority of students attending
2.34	the school served by the officer;
2.35	(2) reviewing and evaluating the 2014 Department of Public Safety statewide
2.36	survey of state resource officers entitled "Law Enforcement in Minnesota Schools: A
