| 1.8 | the commissioner or the health-related licensing boards as defined in section 214.01, |
| 1.9 | subdivision 2. Individuals licensed or registered by the commissioner or the health-related |
| 1.10 | licensing boards shall provide information to the commissioner of health that the |
| 1.11 | commissioner may, pursuant to section 144.052, require. The commissioner shall publish |
| 1.12 | at least biennially, a report which indicates the type of information available and methods |
| 1.13 | for requesting the information. |
