1.14	commissioner may solicit proposals from providers and implement those that, on a
1.15	competitive basis, best meet the state's policy objectives, giving preference to providers that
1.16	serve at least 75 percent elderly waiver participants or at least 25 percent brain injury or
1.17	community access for disability inclusion waiver participants. The commissioner shall limit
1.18	expenditures under this subdivision to the amount appropriated for this purpose.
