1.7	Section 1. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 201.054, subdivision 1, is amended to read:
1.8	Subdivision 1. Registration. (a) An individual may register to vote:
1.9	(1) at any time before the 20th day preceding any election as provided in section 201.061,
1.10	subdivision 1;
1.11	(2) on the day of an election as provided in section 201.061, subdivision 3; or
1.12	(3) when submitting an absentee ballot, by enclosing a completed registration application
1.13	as provided in section 203B.04, subdivision 4.
1.14	(b) An individual who is under the age of 18, but who is at least 16 years of age and
1.15	otherwise eligible, may submit a voter registration application as provided in section 201.061,
1.16	subdivisions 1 and 1b.

1.18	Subd. 2. Prohibitions; penalty. No individual shall intentionally:

- Subd. 1b. Preregistration. An individual who is under the age of 18, but who is at least
 16 years of age and meets all requirements for eligibility in section 201.014, except for age,
 may submit a voter registration application at the address in which the voter maintains
 residence pursuant to subdivision 1. Nothing in this section shall be construed to entitle an
 individual to appear on a polling place roster or cast a ballot at an election if the individual
 does not meet all eligibility requirements for voting, including age.

2.14 Sec. 4. Minnesota Statutes 2022, section 201.071, subdivision 1, is amended to read:

Subdivision 1. Form. Both paper and electronic voter registration applications must 2.15 contain the same information unless otherwise provided by law. A voter registration 2.16 application must contain spaces for the following required information: voter's first name, 2.17 middle name, and last name; voter's previous name, if any; voter's current address; voter's 2.18 previous address, if any; voter's date of birth; voter's municipality and county of residence; 2.19 voter's telephone number, if provided by the voter; date of registration; current and valid 2.20 Minnesota driver's license number or Minnesota state identification number, or if the voter 2.21 has no current and valid Minnesota driver's license or Minnesota state identification, the 2.22 last four digits of the voter's Social Security number; and voter's signature. The paper 2.23 2.24 registration application may include the voter's email address, if provided by the voter. The electronic voter registration application must include the voter's email address. The 2.25 registration application may include the voter's interest in serving as an election judge, if 2.26 indicated by the voter. The application must also contain the following certification of voter 2.27 eligibility: 2.28

4.11 Before inspecting the public information list or obtaining a list of voters or other
4.12 information from the list, the individual shall provide identification to the public official
4.13 having custody of the public information list and shall state in writing that any information
4.14 obtained from the list will not be used for purposes unrelated to elections, political activities,
4.15 or law enforcement. Requests to examine or obtain information from the public information
4.16 lists or the statewide registration system must be made and processed in the manner provided
4.17 in the rules of the secretary of state.

Upon receipt of a statement signed by the voter that withholding the voter's name from
the public information list is required for the safety of the voter or the voter's family, the
secretary of state and county auditor must withhold from the public information list the
name of a registered voter.

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Sec. 6. TRANSITION TO NEW APPLICATION FORMS.

4.23 After the effective date of this act, an election official may use existing voter registration
4.24 forms that do not comply with the requirements in section 4 for applicants who are 18 years
4.25 of age or older at the time of registration. Applicants who are 16 years of age at the time of
4.26 registration must use an application form that meets the requirements in section 4. Beginning
4.27 on the effective date of this act, an election official must not print or copy voter registration
4.28 applications that do not meet the requirements of section 4.
