\$8,000,000 in fiscal year 2020 is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner 3.12

of employment and economic development for transfer to the commissioner of education 3.13

for emergency distance learning wireless or wire-line broadband access for student grants 3.14

for school districts and charter schools under section 1. Up to five percent of the appropriation 3.15

under this paragraph may be used to reimburse reasonable costs incurred by the Department 3.16
